


# Why do religious believers pray?


Before offering Salah Muslims need to prepare themselves by making sure they are clean. They do this by carrying out Wudu (ablution), which is washing themselves.



## Why do we do this?

The *Qur'an* states:  
"For Allah loves those who turn to Him constantly and He loves those who keep themselves pure and clean."

This shows purity.




Evaluate the impact this would have on the daily life of a Muslim

All Muslims stand upright on their prayer mats facing Ka'bah in Saudi Arabia. Muslims pray to remember Allah and to be close to Allah.

**Prostration-** the act of bowing, face down, before something (in this case God).

**Parents take legal action after a school forced Muslim children to pray OUTSIDE kneeling in the playground in the rain and leaving them 'soaked to the skin'**

Muslim pupils at Mirfield Free Grammar School are allegedly being forced to pray outside

Parents are considering legal action as children are praying in rain and snow

The school's Executive Principal Lorraine Barker said: 'We are a broadly Christian academy and have never had a prayer room.

'Before students join the sixth form we make them aware of the facilities we have on site and we are clear that we have no prayer room. We have no extra space within the school.

'Sixth form students are welcome to go off site in order to pray and we have made arrangements in the local community for this to happen.'

Solicitor Yunus Lunatt said the situation should not have reached this stage.

He said: 'The students are not asking for anything that is outside the scope of the law. The school is adamant that it meets the requirements of the Equality Act. I have written to the school asking them one question: how?

- 1. Do you think the Muslim students have a right to be provided with a more suitable place to pray?**
- 2. Do you think the school is within its right to only provide a place offsite for the children to pray?**
- 3. What do you think the best solution is for the problem?**
