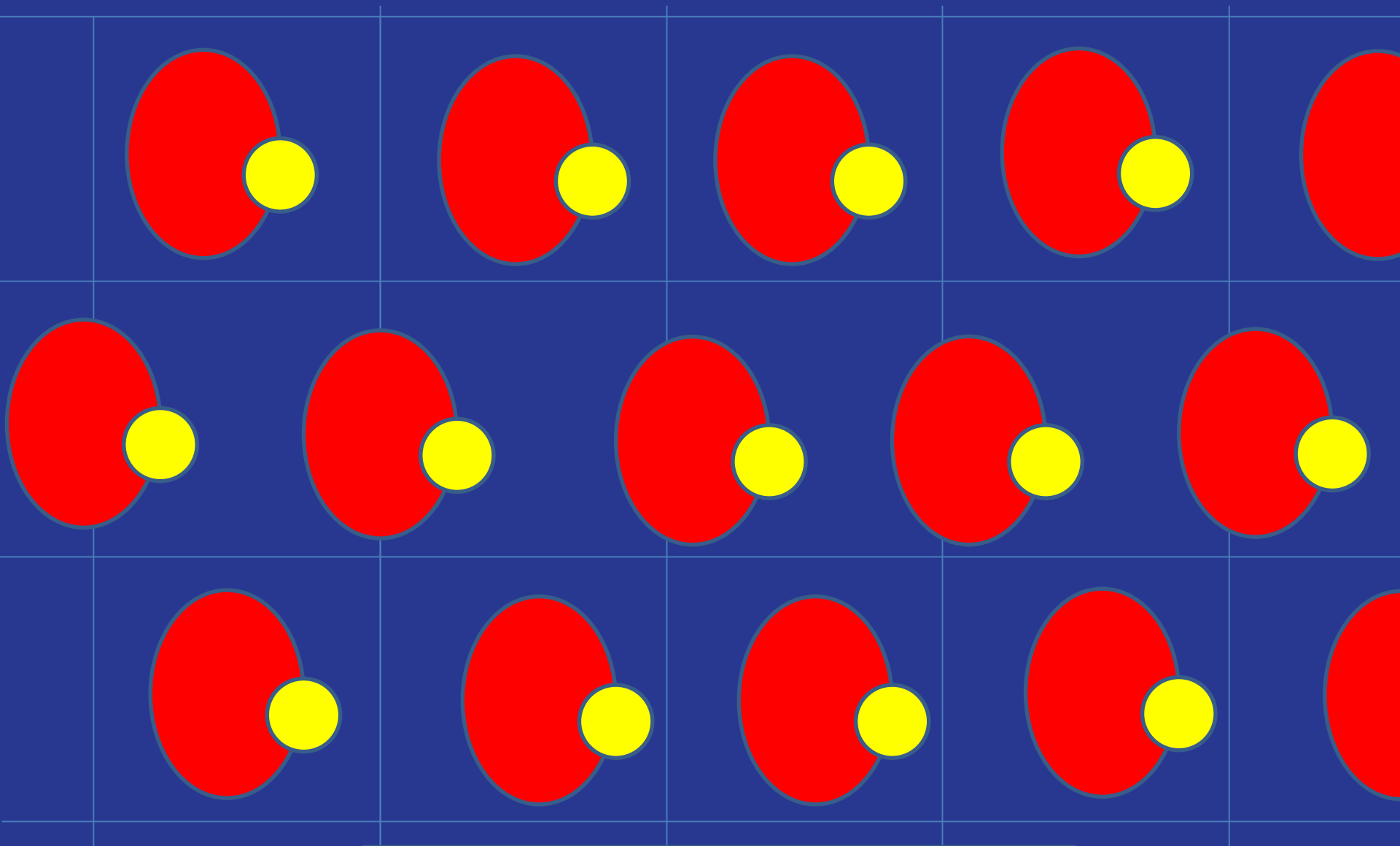

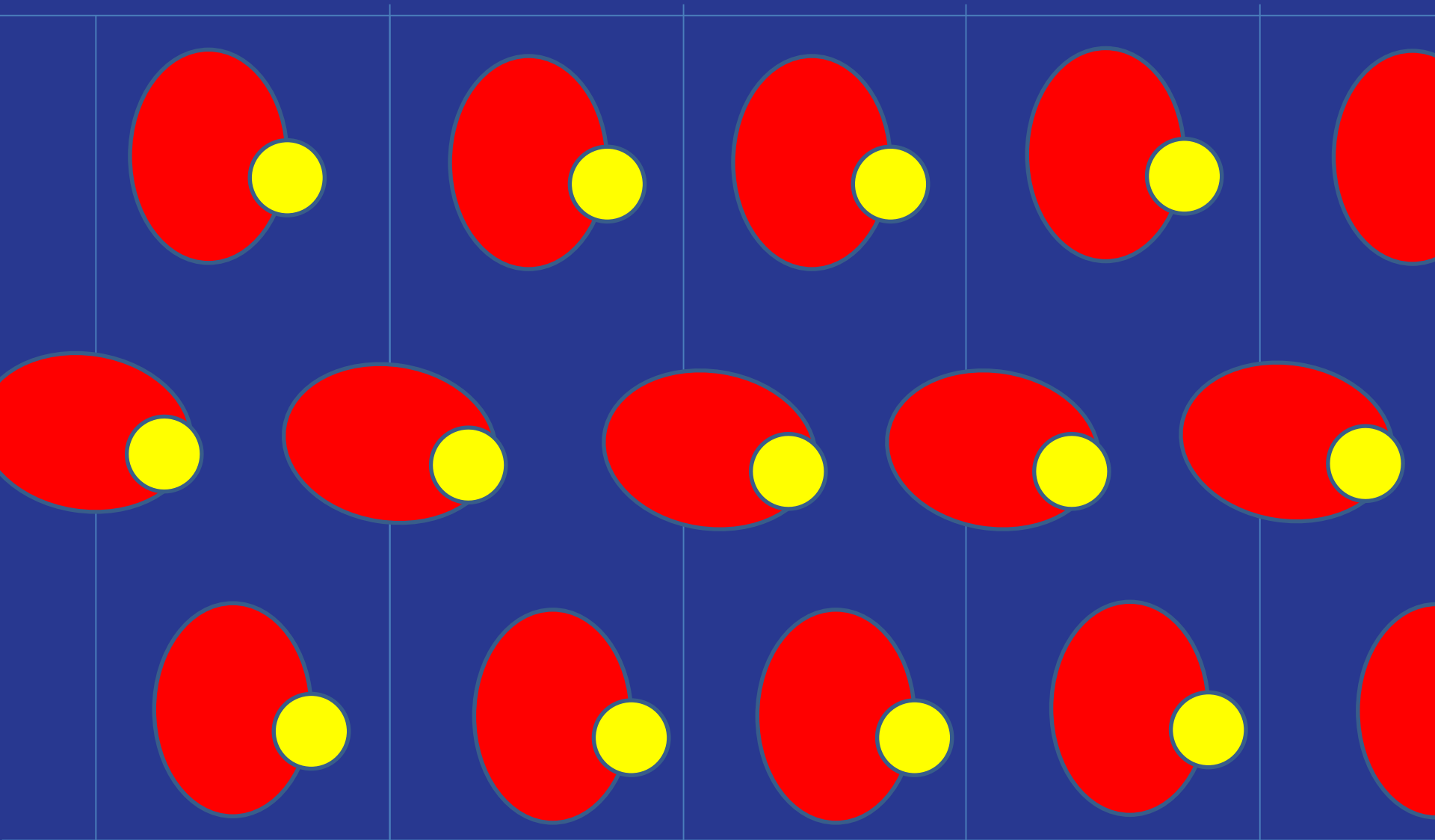
Straight repeat
