On the other side of the fence, the upper part of the field was full of rabbit holes. In places the grass was gone altogether and everywhere there were clusters of dry rabbit droppings, through which nothing but weeds would grow. A hundred yards away, at the bottom of the slope, ran the stream, no more than three feet wide. It was half choked with dry reeds, watercress and blue brooklime. The cart track crossed by a brick pipe and climbed the opposite slope to a fivebarred gate in the thorn hedge. The gate led into the lane.
