**If you got question 2 incorrect, read the following and attempt the question again.**

- Definition  
'A cult of personality is where a leader uses propaganda to convince people to worship him or her, and treat them like a god.'
- In Chapter 8, Orwell describes how there were celebrations following the Battle of the Windmill, '... songs, speeches, and more firing of the gun ... In the general rejoicings the unfortunate affair of the banknotes was forgotten. ... The general feeling on the farm was expressed in a poem entitled 'Comrade Napoleon', which was composed by Minimus ... Napoleon approved of this poem and caused it to be inscribed on the wall of the big barn, at the opposite end from the Seven Commandments. It was surmounted by a portrait of Napoleon, in profile, executed by Squealer in white pain.'

Which of these are examples of how Napoleon has built a cult of personality on the farm? (2)

- a) He makes the animals sing songs about him.
- b) He got rid of Snowball.
- c) He uses wild dogs to terrify the animals.
- d) He has a portrait of himself painted on the end of the barn.
- e) He sells the wood to Frederick at the last moment instead of Pilkington.

Definition of 'propaganda'

'Propaganda is information, which is often false, which a political organisation published to make people agree with what it is saying.'  
In Chapter 7, the animals are starving but the pigs are determined to show the humans that the farm is doing well: '... Napoleon ordered the almost empty bins in the store-shed to be filled nearly to the brim with sand, which was then covered up with what remained of the grain and meal. On some suitable pretext Whymper was led through the store-shed and allowed to catch a glimpse of the bins. He was deceived, and continued to report to the outside world that there was no food shortage on Animal Farm.'

Why do the pigs use propaganda on Animal Farm?
